

The following pre-requisite courses are required for the Respiratory Therapy Program

Human Anatomy & Physiology I – BIO 2011 (4 credits)

Human Anatomy & Physiology II – BIO 2012 (4 credits)

Courses must be completed at a regionally accredited college or University and be considered equivalent at Vermont State University. Must earn "C" or better in each course for credit to be accepted at Vermont State University, but grades of "B" or better in each course would be recommended to be competitive in applicant pool.


