CCV COURSES

NEW STUDENT PROGRESS AT CCV

Of the first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students enrolled in fall 2010, 12% were still enrolled in fall 2013, 13% had graduated, and 28% had transferred on to another institution. For CCV, this group of students represented 4.67% of the total fall 2010 enrollment. Within this group of first-time full-time degree students who graduated, 43% were male, 57% female, and 4% self-identified as a member of a minority racial or ethnic group. Also, 67% received Pell grants, 8% had a subsidized Stafford Loan and no Pell grant, and 25% had neither.
