### Agencies on Aging Helpline

The VT Association of Area Agencies on Aging shares a helpline between most of the state's Agencies on Aging. **Vermonters can call the toll-free, confidential helpline at 1-800-642-5119, between 8:30am-4:30pm on weekdays for any questions related to aging and services.** Some topics they can help with include (but are not limited to): caregiver support; adult day programs; Meals on Wheels; Medicare/Medicaid; SSI/SS; senior centers; and much more. ### Important Medicaid Action!



Starting in April, the Department of Health Access will begin reviewing income and age limits of current Medicaid recipients. People will receive a postcard notifying them when their case is under review, and a letter after their eligibility is determined with instructions to submit updated information, do nothing, or find new insurance.

**Current recipients should log in to their account and update their mailing address, contact information, income, and household size.**

If you are no longer eligible, you can use the plan comparison tool on VT Health Connect or work with an assister. Assisters can also help if you are confused by notices received in the mail.

Interpreters are available by phone. Eligibility will be determined by current monthly income (not annual income for 2022). Scan the QR code to be taken to the plan comparison tool.
