# What does it mean to transfer?

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- To complete an associate's degree or certificate at one college, with the intention of completing a bachelor's degree at another institution.



# Why Complete a Certificate or degree at CCV First?

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- There are many benefits to starting your post-secondary education at a community college.
- Develop college-level skills in a supportive environment
- Earn a credential
- Opportunity to demonstrate academic potential before applying to “goal school”
- Flexibility of school schedule (work, family obligations)
- Guaranteed admission to some schools (pathways, articulation agreements)
- Cost-effective to take classes at CCV first
- Most high-paying jobs require a bachelor's degree



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# Transfer Options

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- **Plan carefully with your Academic Advisor**
  - Most transfer schools use criteria-based admissions.
- **Articulation Agreements, Partnerships, & Pathways**
  - CCV has special transfer agreements with many colleges granting bachelor's degrees.
    - ~ 36 bachelor degree programs
    - Course-by-course transfer maps
    - Admissions to BOTH colleges guaranteed

# Transfer Coordinators & Transfer Offices

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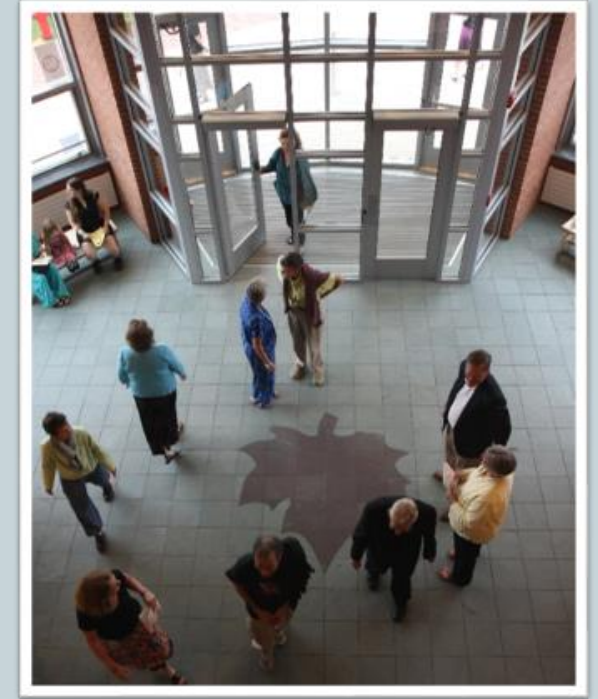
- The Transfer Coordinators at the school you plan to continue your education at are the most accurate source of information.

# Types of Admissions

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- **CCV is “Open Admissions”**
  - No SAT/ACT required
  - No essay required
  - No application fees
- **Regular Admissions**
- **Rolling Admissions**





# Application Deadlines

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- **Pay attention to the timeline:** some schools only allow you to start in the fall, while others allow you to start in any semester or term.
- If you plan to start in the fall, most four-year schools will expect you to apply by April or May, but some schools or specific programs have much earlier application deadlines. For example, if you plan to start in the Fall of 2023 at VTSU's LPN program, the deadline is December 1.
- UVM Transfer Deadline:
  - To start classes in the Fall Semester: June 1
  - To start classes in the Spring Semester: November 1
- Champlain College Deadline: Rolling



# What are Schools Looking For?

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- **Solid Grades**
- **GPA**
- **Specific Transferable Courses:**
  - English Composition, Math, other general education requirements
  - For Allied Health Majors: A&P I and II, Intro to Nutrition, Intro to Psychology, Human Growth & Development
  - Be aware of lab science requirements (3 v. 4 credit science courses)
- High school grades and standardized test scores of less importance, unless you are recent high school graduate.
- Often basic college admissions requirements are met by graduating from high school (language classes).
- **Are there any options for a less than stellar transcript?**
  - Grade Amelioration

# Transcripts

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- You will need to submit an official transcript to the school you are applying to, unless you are applying to the other VSCS school: Vermont State University.
- The easiest way to order a transcript is via the Portal under "Student Quick Links."
- There is a processing fee of \$6.50 per transcript. If you are going to be ordering a transcript, make sure your account has a zero balance.
- Although some schools do, CCV does not offer mid-term transcripts. You may have to apply with your most recent transcript and send another official transcript when the current semester is complete.
